## FROM THE PRESIDENT

The banquet and photo contest broke all records for attendance and great fun. A thank you goes to Nancy Rash and Lyle Moen for organizing a terrific banquet. Another thank you to Sylvia Seymour for organizing and tabulating the photo contest. We seem to get more entries each year and making a selection gets more difficult. And the biggest thank you goes to Keith Riewerts for arranging for Jamie Gossard to come as a featured speaker. This is the first time since I have been a member that we have sponsored a speaker. I hope everyone enjoyed it as much as I did. I think we learned a lot about what it takes to be a world-class hybridizer.

A short survey at the October meeting was circulated to see how the members felt about some ideas that had come our way. If the board did not respond to members' ideas and inquiries, we would be chastised for being unresponsive and rightly so. That's what the survey was about: responding to member ideas and asking the members' opinions.

Thirty-seven surveys were returned. Nothing will change for the foreseeable future.

- On the subject of new nametags: 2 did not care, 1 didn't answer, 13 said 'yes' and 21 said 'no'.
- On the subject of moving the silent auction: 1 did not care, 13 voted to move to May; 23 voted to keep the auction in August.

New board officers were elected at the November banquet. We still are looking for a secretary for a 1-year term. If you are interested, please contact Nancy Carlisle or Donna Denley.

At the April 2013 meeting, the club voted to keep 'Iris' in the club name. We need someone to be an **Iris Advocate** and bring some iris related event or programming into the club. Please contact me if you are interested in taking on this position.

**Committee Chairs and Helpers** -- Sign-up sheets for committee chairs and helpers will be at the January, February, and March meetings. If you will not be there and want to participate, please let me know. We need helpers for all the planned events. We need members to staff a table at the Winter Gardening Fair at Kirkwood and The Art Of Gardening at Muscatine. We will provide lunch tickets for these two events. Both events have been valuable in getting out information about the club and about the plant sales.

## MINUTES FROM NOV. 23 BOARD MEETING

The fall Board Meeting was held in Cedar Rapids. Members in attendance: Jonathan Poulton, Nancy Carlisle, Heather Harroun, Myrna Hass, Lynn Stoll, Lynn Kroemer, Karmin Mullins, Zora Ronan, and Sherry Baldonado. Guests in attendance: Debbie Hansen, Loren Hass, and Randy Kroemer.

The secretary board position is still open. We will continue to seek a permanent secretary. Until that happens, the president will send out the NL and communication e-mails. Eight members currently receive communication via snail mail. (Donna Denly updated the list to remove Susan Minger and add Melvin Burgess and Suzanne & Robert Moffit.)

The plant sales were discussed. Revenue for both sales was below projections. The May sale location is a problem because of parking problems. The board will pursue a possible new location for 2015 unless something good comes available for 2014. The August sale lacked its usual number of customers. Jonathan Poulton suggested that we need more and better publicity. Heather Harroun suggested using Face Book or other social media. Finding a possible new location for the May sale and developing a publicity plan will be projects for the next year.

Nancy Carlisle will ask Nathan Kirkman if he will update the promotional flier. We need to have it available for the Winter Gardening Fair in February.

Members who remained unpaid for 2013 were removed from the membership list. Five names were removed, leaving 117 members.

## CLUB PLANT DISTRIBUTION

**Club Plants** – Activities in 2013 will count for the club plants distributed in 2014. The last qualifier for 2014 club plants is payment of dues by April 1, 2014. The list of members who have qualified for a 2014 club plant (assuming they pay dues by April 1, 2014) can be found at the end of this newsletter. If you do not see your name and you think you should have qualified, please contact me as soon as possible. It will not be possible to make corrections the day of the plant distribution.

January starts a new year, and we will begin accruing activities toward earning a club plant for distribution in 2015. Here is a recap of the rules on earning club plants:

### ELIGIBILITY FOR CLUB PLANT DISTRIBUTION:

A club plant is a reward for being an active member of the club. Each year, CVIDS will use a portion of its funds to buy some choice daylilies that will be distributed in the spring to eligible members to grow in their garden for two years.

**ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS:** To be eligible to receive a club plant for the current year, a member must have:

- Paid membership dues for both the current and previous years (paid by April 1 of each year).
- Contributed to the club's activities during the previous calendar year (January 1 through December 31) by undertaking any two of the following:
  - (1) Attended two club meetings (includes garden tour but not the banquet)
  - (2) Served as a CVIDS Board member
  - (3) Chaired or co-chaired a committee
  - (4) Donated plants to a club sale
  - (5) Assisted at the CVIDS plant sales or auctions
  - (6) Presented a club program
  - (7) Hosted a CVIDS garden tour
  - (8) Written an article for the newsletter
  - (9) Bid in the Silent Auction of returning club plants
  - (10) Performed any other activity that contributes to the success of the club.

## **NOV. 23 BOARD MEETING MINUTES** (continued)

The 2013 budget was reviewed. This was the first year the club operated with a formal budget. Last year was an unusual year and because of two club-plant returns revenue from returning club plants was up overall. Revenue from plant sales was down. Revenue from the banquet raffle and auction covered the cost of the speaker.

The 2014 budget estimates were reviewed and discussed, resulting in a proposed budget that will be presented at the January 2014 meeting for membership approval. There were several noteworthy budgetary changes when compared with 2013. Taken as a whole, these would lead to a significant reduction in the club's bank balance.

### **Miscellaneous items:**

⊖ Eighty-one members qualify for club plants in 2014. To keep the plant quality up, an increased allotment was needed.

⊖ The board felt that a new member welcoming packet including a tote bag would be a good marketing tool.

⊖ The regional meeting is in 2019. The board would like to dedicate seed money into a separate account to prepare for the regional meeting. Money for deposits, plants, etc. is often needed several years in advance.
